



To Parents, Guardians and Carers

Well this is certainly a year to date that has thrown us a curve ball or two. In the light of recent developments and in line with the Department of Health and our [Education Minister's announcement](#), I would encourage, for the safety of students and staff, that if you haven't already done so, please keep your children home. We understand that there are exceptions to this, for example those working in essential services where other options aren't available.

To support you, our online links and Learning from Home options will be made available to you from Monday 30th March.

Formal shut down of Education doesn't occur until Week 10 (April 6th) and then we are still required to provide supervision for a small handful of students. Next Term we anticipate that the way we deliver Education will change shape.

I am proposing we keep our community safe by doing our very best to minimise risk and start operating from home from next week. The large majority (85%) have already kept their students home but until now we have been working hard to build the online and digital support needed for online learning to be viable. In regards to our Senior School students, in particular our Year 12 students, we are to take direction from SCSA – currently what has been put in place for our Senior School students is to continue until such times as SCSA issues a new direction.

Parent Access to our College

We are endeavouring to prioritise the health and safety of our community, meet Department of Education and Health Department guidelines to the very best of our ability. I'd like to thank you in advance for your support around this.

Next week we have made the decision, in order to protect our community, that parents will not have direct access to the front office. If parents need to enter the premises from 8.15 to 2.45 Monday to Friday for the next two weeks they can ring from the front door and we will provide access as required or release students into your care. Any essential meetings we will schedule via teleconference.

Gate Access for Students Restricted

The only two gates open for the next two weeks will be those near the bike racks and the gates near front Admin.

Canteen Closed

Our canteen will not be open next week so if you need to send students to school please ensure they have a packed lunch and a water bottle so they don't have to use our water fountains.

These are certainly challenging times and ones that will certainly define us in how we choose to respond to them. Our children, our families and our community are afraid right now, understandably so, as our world changes around us at an alarming rate. The challenge for us is to ensure that we take charge of our physical safety, and also our mental health. We need to find ways to look after our mental set and support each other. Our cleaners and staff have worked overtime to ensure our high touch surfaces are clean and regularly sanitised. Health and wellbeing is important and I need to thank staff – teaching and non-teaching, for their dedication and professionalism, ensuring we adapt to meet the safety requirements, provide pastoral care support whilst still maintaining progress around our learning goals. With reduced numbers we have had to adapt accordingly and I know everyone is doing their very best.

Virtual Learning Commencing Next Week 30th March

We are working hard to ensure our students are supported and can engage in remote learning opportunities. This is going to look different in different homes and there isn't a one size fits all model. We are currently working out the best way to disseminate and provide access to this information to you in the most user friendly way.


